His victory over death entitled him Redeemer!


Over the centuries it has continued to happen.

#### Meet the disciples: Jude

Jude, also known as Judas, Lebbeus and Thaddaeus, was one of the 12 disciples. He became known as Jude after early translators of the New Testament from Greek into English sought to distinguish him from Judas Iscariot and subsequently abbreviated his forename.

In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew he is only referred to once using the name Thaddaeus. In Luke, he is referred to once as Judas son of James. And in John again there is one reference to him, this time as Judas.

Other than having his name listed once in each of the Gospels as being one of the disciples, there is nothing in the Bible to tell us anything about Jude.

According to tradition, Jude was born into a Jewish family in Paneas, a town in Galilee later rebuilt during the Roman period and renamed Caesarea Philippi.

After Jesus' death it is said that Jude preached the Gospel in Judea, Samaria, Idumaea, Syria, Mesopotamia and Libya.

According to the Armenian tradition, Saint Jude suffered martyrdom about AD 65 in Beirut, together with the apostle Simon the Zealot, with whom he is usually connected. Their acts and martyrdom were recorded in an Acts of Simon and Jude that was among the collection of passions and legends traditionally associated with the legendary Abdias, bishop of Babylon.
